



Breast Pumps

Purchase and Rental Information from MilkWorks

Breast pumps are not designed to replace breastfeeding. In most situation, they are not as effective as baby in removing milk and maintaining milk supply. The effectiveness of any breast pump varies with each woman, depending upon her milk supply, the ease of her let down and her pumping needs.

Pumping can help initiate milk supply when baby cannot latch/suckle vigorously or when relactating or adopting. They can help "pull out" inverted/flat nipples, reduce engorgement or maintain milk supply while healing sore nipples.

Prices are approximated just for a general idea of the actual cost.

The Pump In Style and Lactina are recommended for a mother who is returning to work or pumping for convenience. It may be advantageous to purchase a Pump In Style if you plan to have more children. MilkWorks has other pumps available also.

The Lactina and Symphony pumps are high quality, hospital grade, double electric pumps. They are FDA approved for multiple users, with no chance for cross contamination.

The Symphony is the newest pump and has 2 phases of cycling for let down and expression and a U shaped vacuum pressure for maximum efficiency and comfort. It is very quiet.

The Symphony is recommended for a mother who is exclusively pumping.

Will insurance companies cover the cost of a pump?

Only if mother or baby are covered by Medicaid, Primary Care Plus, or Share Advantage.

Take your Medicaid card and a prescription from the baby's doctor when you go to MilkWorks to get a pump. The prescription can be faxed to 423-6422.

Most private companies do not reimburse for a pump rental, but you should confirm this with them.

MilkWorks also rents high quality digital baby scales for \$20/week or \$66/month.
